Why is my tax refund being held at Child Support?	If you filed a joint return – funds will be held for 6 month from the date of collection or it may be held for pending court issues	It may be held for pending court issues

How will my tax refund be split if I have more than one case?	After any arrearage owed the State is paid the remainder of the refund will be pro-rated to all case/orders submitted based on percentage of total arrears	The refund will be pro-rated to all cases/orders submitted based on percentage of total arrears
When will Child Support receive my refund?	Four to six weeks after you receive the tax offset notice	If you filed a joint return it will be six to eight weeks after you receive the tax offset notice
