Does Child Support Stop When A Child Graduates High School?

Batavia, Ohio. As high school graduation ceremonies near each year, the Clermont County Child Support Enforcement (CSE) office receives many inquiries relating to whether or not child support and medical insurance orders stop on the date of graduation. Ohio law states that the emancipation date of a child is when he or she reaches 18 and has graduated, or is not attending an accredited high school on a full time basis (whichever date is latest), not to exceed the age of 19, unless otherwise specified by court order.

Ohio law mandates custodial parents must notify CSE when there is any reason that child support should stop; contact CSE as your child nears 18 to ensure proper continuation or termination of a child support order.
